

Almost all fonts allow embedding, so that shouldn't be a problem. This is a requirement for ETD submission at BYU In order to embed a font in a PDF document you must have that font available on your system and the font needs to allow embedding. You will see a list of fonts. Using the normal Adobe Reader (or Foxit if you prefer). What you CAN do, if you have access, is use Adobe Acrobat Pro XI or DC and use PREFLIGHT functions to fix it. I believe there is a way to embed all fonts in a PDF, but I cannot seem to get this to work. To embed the fonts that are not already embedded, go to File > Print You can embed or substitute fonts in Acrobat or when you export an InDesign document to PDF. You can embed the entire font, or just a subset of the characters used in the file. Check your fonts.
