If this confuses the child, cover the top line completely.) Ask the child to identify only the first symbol on the line below the covering card. The right column is for screening the left eye of the standardized chart layout. If a child requires assistance knowing which optotype to identify, the screener should point briefly beneath the optotype and quickly remove the pointer. FigureLEA Symbols visual acuity tests are single optotype tests, standard line tests, and line tests with tightly grouped optotypes. Repeat this procedure for each or every second line (moving quickly down the chart to avoid tiring the child) until the child hesitates or misidentifies a symbol LEA SYMBOLS® or HOTV wall charts and flip charts have either shapes or letters which are referred to generally as optotypes in this procedure.
