When the reader can't determine the antecedent (the noun) to which a pronoun is referring, it interferes with the meaning of the sentence. You could combine the two parts into a single statement: The fact that Harry was always late drove his teacher crazy. To correct a vague pronoun, replace the pronoun with its noun antecedent.
