Ethiopia's coffee sector. Coffee accounts for nearly one-third of total exports by value. Ethiopia's coffee export earnings contribute more than 10 percent of total production. In 2019, Ethiopian exports are estimated to reach 1.5 million bags of coffee (metric ton), making it, once again, the most important African coffee exporter and the tenth largest exporter in the world. Coffee is the country's top export. The International Coffee Organization would actively assist the project. At worst, they say there will be a 10 percent increase by Ethiopia, which is the main African coffee producer, will face serious consequences since coffee exports. Exports in Ethiopia averaged USD 1.5 billion from 2010 until, reaching an all-time high of USD 2.5 billion in the second quarter of 2019 and a record low of USD 0.5 billion in the third quarter of 2019. Ethiopia's main exports are gold (15 percent of total exports) and coffee (10 percent). Coffee plays a pivotal role in the socio-economy of the country. The study employed an extended generalized Cobb–Douglas production function model using data from the National Bank of Ethiopia and World Bank data base from 2010 to 2019. The aim of this article is to examine export determinants of Ethiopian coffee to trade partner countries using a dynamic gravity model and system generalized method of estimation (GMM) for the period 2010–2019. It employs more than 10 percent of the economically active population and continues. We study the structure and performance of the coffee export sector in Ethiopia, Africa's most important coffee producer, over the period 2010 to 2019. We find Coffee is Ethiopia's main export commodity, contributing to the livelihoods of more than 10 million smallholder farmers and other actors in the coffee sector. Others include: live animals, oilseeds. Coffee is Ethiopia's number one source of export revenue generating about 10 percent of the country's total export earnings. Therefore, the main objective of the study is to examine the impact of the Ethiopian coffee economy by the Government's National Coffee Board (NCB). According to Ethiopia trade data, 2019 exports reached a record of almost 1.5 million metric tons, valued at \$ 2.5 billion. Major export destinations are Germany, Saudi Arabia, the United States, and Japan. We study the structure and performance of the coffee export sector in Ethiopia, Africa's most important coffee producer, over the period 2010 to 2019. We find an evolving policy environment leading to structural changes in the export sector, including an elimination of vertical integration for most exporters. The major objective of this study was to examine the impact of Coffee exports on economic growth in Ethiopia.
