Present it to all your health care providers Providers are required to honor the wishes outlined in the MOST form. The POLST decision-making process and resulting medical orders are intended for patients who are considered to be at risk for a life-threatening clinical event because they have a serious life-limiting condition The MOST form travels with a patient as they move from care setting to care setting and carries the weight of formal medical orders.
