

Select one or more files, and then drag them to your computer. Split PDFs online into two or more unique files. Cut out the word "District," resize the box for "Date" and then add a new text box for "District." The same with "Contract Owner," "Address," "Permit/Case No," and "Inspection Code." Right-click on the PDF file. Select "Get Info." This tutorial shows how to split a PDF into multiple files in Microsoft Power Automate Desktop. Open the PDF using Adobe Acrobat or free Adobe Acrobat Reader.
