Tom won't be late, They don't like us, That The question tag relates directly to the sentence. They are often used for checking information that we think we know is true. Question tags can either have a rising intonation. The meaning of a question tag changes if your voice goes up or down when you say it. We usually use them when we more or less know the answer, but we want the listener to agree with us or confirm some information. It was a good film, wasn't it? Normally we use a positive question tag with a negative sentence: negative sentence + positive tag. These are some examples of question tags to ask for someone's agreement or to keep a conversation going. We add question tags to the end of statements to turn them into questions.
