Visit our Saudi Arabia Jurisdiction First: The Implementing Regulation of the Personal Data. The terms and phrases used in this Regulation shall have the meanings assigned to them in Article (1) of the Personal Data Protection Law issued by Royal Decree No. (M/19) dated 9/2/H and amended by Royal Decree No. (M/) dated 5/9/ AH. The following terms and phrases wherever used in this Regulation shall have the following meanings:

**Objectives.** Kingdom. The law requires companies outside Saudi Arabia that process personal data of data subjects in Saudi Arabia, to appoint a representative in Saudi Arabia to comply with their obligations under the law.

**Sensitive Data:** Personal Data revealing racial or ethnic origin, or religious, intellectual or political belief, data relating to security criminal convictions and offenses, biometric or Genetic Data for the purpose of identifying the person, Health Data, and data that indicates that one or both of the individual's parents are unknown of Saudi Arabia ("PDPL"), approved by the Royal Decree No/m, dated /2/9, and to explain how the PDPL will apply.

**Purpose:** Aim Data protection in the Article Definitions. Preserve the privacy of individuals and enable them to exercise their rights when their personal data is processed. Enhance national data sovereignty and maintain the privacy of individuals when their personal data is processed outside the Kingdom.

The terms and phrases used in the Regulations shall have the meanings set out in Article of the Personal Data Protection Law issued by Royal Decree No. M/19, dated 9/2/ AH, in addition to the following meanings, unless the context requires otherwise:

**Law:** Personal Data Protection Law The PDPL applies to any processing by businesses or public entities of personal data performed in Saudi Arabia by any means whatsoever, including the processing of the personal data of Saudi residents by entities located outside the Kingdom.
