In this lesson we will learn what finger to use when plucking. Pattern-based fingerpicking is a style of fingerpicking where you fingerpick the rhythm of a song in a repeating fingerpicking pattern while you sing the melody of the song. Learn how to play ukulele with different picking patterns using right-hand thumb and fingers. When you pick the strings in a pattern-like way, it begins to make much more sense to use multiple fingers instead of just the thumb. Pick in a downward motion with your thumb; curve your index and middle fingers to play the strings upward. This allows for more comfortable hand positioning and speed. Four-Finger Picking Technique. Try to play as evenly as possible, giving an equal amount of time to each note. Berkeley Ukulele Club Fingerpicking Exercises Instructions. A pluck on the A string (m)-pluck with middle finger E(i)-pluck with index finger C(t) pluck with thumb G- Thumb pluck and pinch, thumb alternating between C and G string (hold a C chord with left hand). Here's a sample pattern: Rest your pinky on the body of your ukulele, just below the strings—doing so will help you keep your bearings as the other fingers move from string to string. Remember, the goal is to keep a steady pattern as you pluck. Lesson: Fingerpicking Technique. PIMA is a notation system that assigns a letter to each picking finger, leaving the pinky out. Picking Pattern. We're going to start with the simplest pattern of the lot, plucking each string, one by one. Repeat, repeat, repeat. For this lesson, you take fingerpicking patterns from previous lessons and practice building fingerpicking speed by using a metronome or through "burst training." As the name implies, the four-finger picking technique is a way of fingerpicking the ukulele using four fingers on your picking hand, with each finger assigned to pluck one of the four strings on the ukulele. To pick the pattern depicted above on an uke in standard (GCEA) tuning, pick the G string with your thumb; the C string with your thumb, the E string with your index finger, and the A string with your middle finger.
