Only a few psychotherapy suitability assessment scales have been studied for their reliability and validity. Psychotherapy outcome prediction by patient suitability has been almost exclusively studied based on short-term therapies Suitability for Psychotherapy Scale (SPS) The evaluation of the suitability for psychotherapy was carried out using a seven-item SPS, which was developed in the Helsinki Psychotherapy Study (Appendix, Table 2). The seven-item scale described in the present study has similarities to other suitability scales Maarit A. Laaksonen et al. This study of psychotherapy suitability and its prediction of psychotherapy outcomes remains scarce, however. Items were suitability was measured with Suitability for Psychotherapy Scale (SPS) total score and seven subscores. The SPS was evaluated at baseline, before initiating the treatments American Journal of Psychotherapy Suitability for Psychotherapy Scale. Kunkin This three-study paper reports on the development of a short self-report measure of attitudes aligned with CBT, named the CBT Suitability Scale (CBT-SUITS). SPS Suitability for Psychotherapy Patients' psychological, intrapsychic and interpersonal, capacities are among the core psychotherapy suitability selection criteria suggested for differentiating those treatable American Journal of Psychotherapy The interview-based Suitability for Psychotherapy Scale (SPS) (Laaksonen et al.,) was used as the predictor of treatment refusal and premature termination in the present psychotherapy suitability: therapy focus, modulation of affects, flexibility of interaction, self-concept in relation to ego ideal, response to trial interpretation, reflective ability, and Arviointiohje. Refusing the offered therapy after randomization was considered The Suitability for Short-Term Cognitive Therapy Rating Scale (SRS) defines criteria to assess suitability for short-term cognitive-behavioral therapy (CBT).
