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A selection of his work can be seen at genesis flowers gallery, cork street, london, 16 march to 15 april. durante o mês de maio, sebastião salgado exhibe no museu da imagem e do som (mis), em são paulo, a mostra 50 anos da revolução dos cravos em portugal, que contará com dezenas de fotografias. brazilian photographer sebastião salgado spent six years travelling around the amazon region, capturing images of the forest, rivers and mountains for his latest book, amazônia. touring exhibitions of his work have been presented throughout the world. immortalizing a vast range of people, from gold miners at brazil' s serra pelada mine to rajasthan women working as stone- haulers genesis in india to starving villagers.
