Translate How to force delete a file with "DEL" command: Step You can press Windows + R keys on the keyboard, type cmd, and press Ctrl + Shift + Enter to run Windows Command Prompt as administrator. Be sure to open the Zip file in Windows Explorer when you are extracting the contents so that Windows Explorer names the files in a manner that it can access, · I found when this was NOT ticked that files and folders within Onedrive that have been download from the cloud would NOT delete. del PUSH*IN*PINTLE.pdf. Point to Note: Using the above method means that if you want your files Permanently available on your Computer you must right Click on the File Folder you want and ensure you have clicked on "Always Keep In order to delete a filename that is too long, follow these steps: Open File Explorer and navigate to the directory where your files are located.
