Current version is Windows only. If the PDF is vectorial, import it into Inkscape (or try an online converter PDF to DXF), export it as a DXF file, and then import the DXF into SketchUp. On Windows there's no direct option to import PDF files but you can generate a PNG or JPG image from it which can be imported. In this SketchUp tutorial, we'll introduce a free tool that you can use to convert PDF's to DXF files, which you can import into SketchUp Pro. There are many times when you currently, you cannot import a PDF directly into SketchUp on the Windows version so the usual way to import something at least is to convert the PDF file into a raster image. Go to the "File" menu and choose "Import" or use the extension's specific import feature. In PDF Importer is SketchUp extension allowing users to import vector PDF drawings directly into SketchUp, without the need for converting to DWG or DXF (CAD) first. You can also avoid clicking your way through the import process. The simplest approach is the one Cotty suggested. Simply drag and drop your image file, say,, directly into the SketchUp modeling window. In this video, we check out PDF Importer an extension from John Brock that can import Vector PDFs directly as geometry inside of SketchUp! A dialog box will appear, allowing you to set various import options. SketchUp for Windows does not support pdf import. CAD files do PDF Importer is SketchUp extension allowing users to import vector PDF drawings directly into SketchUp, without the need for converting to DWG or DXF (CAD) first. PDF is unfortunately not available as an import format in SketchUp, except in the Mac version that can import them as raster images. If you were given the floor plans as DWG PDF Importer for SketchUp imports vector PDFs directly into SketchUp, without having to convert to DWG or DXF first.
