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naguib mahfouz, the first and only writer of arabic to be awarded the nobel prize for literature, wrote prolifically from the 1930s until shortly before his death in, in a variety of genres: novels, short stories, plays, screenplays, a regular weekly newspaper column, and in later life his intensely brief and evocative dreams.
