Right-click the selected files to show the context menu. This is an easy way to bring multiple PDFs together into one. Sort your files by dragging and putting them in the order you want them to be merged in. From the ribbon bar, This will be the donor document. Hover your cursor over the Tile option and select Horizontally. This is the "master" document where you'll combine all of your Word documents into a single file. You can access this option by clicking on the Window tab in the menu. Our tool above can combine two or even up to PDFs for you. Set rngListStart = ("I4 ") The cell reference I4 should be the first cell in the list of items to loop through. Step 1: Open the Merge PDF tool. Upload the PDF files you want to merge.
