These steps fall under the fourth phase of the attack, "Seizing the Objective", and are sequential. Special Tactics prefers the term "Room Clearing Tactics" (RCT) over "Close Quarters Battle" (CQB) since RCT is more descriptive of the specific skill set commonly referred to as CQB. By definition CQB would include hand-to-hand fighting, trench techniques which western infantries have adopted to clear individual rooms.
