Rural notes for settlement geography grade() unit study of settlements p settlement place where people live. buildings. and also A settlement is an organized colony of human beings consisting of buildings in which they live or work or store various things and streets on which their movements take place. Settlement geography is the study of human land, water and resource use, population density patterns, and settlement growth It is essential to urban planning and urban landscape. A town, city, metropolis, conurbation and megalopolis are urban settlements. The term settlement geography is derived being a port for trade, whilst other settlements can have religious, cultural or administrative functions. WET-POINT SETTLEMENT DRY = when location of settlement site is determined entirely by the presence of a water source. Key factors in determining a settlement site include climate, resources, defense needs, and What Is Settlement Geography? Especially: dry areas – water is needed daily and is heavy to transport -POINT SETTLEMENT = a settlement site that is chosen in an attempt to avoid water, because of the danger of flooding. Settlement site and situation The piece of land upon which a settlement is built is the settlement site. There are many reasons why a site might be chosen for the development of a settlement and some factors will be more important than others Settlements are classified from the smallest to the largest.
