Abstract Objective: To estimate a minimal clinically important difference (MCID) on the adult ADHD Quality of Life (AAQoL) scale. The purpose of this study was to validate the AAQoL. The AAQoL appears to be a valid measure of quality of life for adults with ADHD and can be considered for incorporation into future studies. Method: The MCID was determined from data from short-term (N =) and long-term (N =), placebo-controlled atomoxetine trials in adults with ADHD. The adult attention-deficit/hyperactivity disorder (ADHD) quality-of-life (AAQoL) scale was previously validated in adult patients in the USA; here, the AAQoL is validated in adult European. To address this gap, the Adult ADHD Quality-of-Life Scale (AAQoL) was developed based on well accepted methods for designing patient reported outcomes.
