The most common risk factors for carotid stenosis are smoking, hypertension, hyperlipidemia, and diabetes mellitus. The initial vital signs are temperature degrees Centigrade, HRbpm, RRbpm, and BP /mm Hg and a pain rating ofout of Carotid stenosis accounts for about% of all cases of ischemic stroke [1], and is considered the single most preventable cause of stroke.
