However, a lack of an image preview makes this tedious working with titles alone. Zotfile is a Zotero plugin to manage your attachments: automatically rename, move, and attach PDFs (or other files) to Zotero items, sync PDFs from your Zotero. Terrifically small pieces of functionality. This is made more frustrating by the lack of a good UI to easily open PDFs in an external reader. This plugin allows previewing Zotero attachments in the library view, but it is no longer maintained since Zotero beta. Zotero PDF Preview is a plugin that allows you to preview PDFs attached to Zotero items in the main Zotero window. openPdfMac is a string with the exact name of the application such as "Preview", "Skim" or PDF references add-on for Zotero. I am absolutely seeing the built-in Zotero PDF reader being an order of magnitude slower than either (on Mac) or DevonThink's built-in PDF reader, on specific PDFs (that do, in fact, have lots of scanned images).
