The bottom line represents the sixth string. The bottom line of the staff represents your lowest "E" string, the second line from the bottom represents your "A" string, etc. Numbers on the lines indicate which fret to play on that string There are quite a few benefits to using guitar TAB. \* It's easy to learn.
